THE PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Summer is upon us and I hope all will enjoy the opportunity to get outside and be active. Much has been happening that affects our Village. Our sidewalks have now been resurfaced by Charter Colony with no cost to Madison Village. Charter Colony is working with VDOT to replace all of Charter Colony street signs. On Wednesday, May 13, the Board met at Community Partners in Executive Session to discuss the bids received from paint contractors. After the Executive Session was adjourned, the Board approved the selection of Robert M. Lissenden. He will power wash all 48 homes, paint the first 18 homes (see separate notice that lists these homes) and power wash and stain the 18 HVAC enclosures of the homes to be painted, as well as paint the roof vents. This painting should be done later this summer. We will keep you informed about the timing. The reserve study has been completed by DMA and the Board will meet with them on June 10 to learn of their findings. We will provide you with the results of this study. Our new trash and recycling pickup will start on June 4. Be sure to place both of your containers out at that time. (See more information in this new program on page 4.) As many of you may have seen, the Chesterfield Planning Commission has deferred a vote on a proposed project that would bring 80 new townhomes to Charter Colony, behind the new Martins store, for 60 days. Concerns expressed were how the development would affect current resources, school overcrowding and traffic issues.

PAINT/POWER WASH SCHEDULE FOR PHASE ONE HOMES

The Madison Village Board, in conjunction with Community Partners, is finalizing the 2015 maintenance plan for power washing and painting. As mentioned in the President's Report, Robert M. Lissenden was selected to perform these services. He will power wash all 48 homes, paint the first 18 homes, and power wash and stain the 18 HVAC enclosures of the homes to be painted, as well as paint the roof vents. Mail box posts for all 48 homes will be painted and mailboxes replaced as needed. Residents will be notified in writing by Community Partners when this work is to be done during the summer months.

If there is wood rot, the homeowner is responsible for repairing/replacing the surfaces before painting begins. Repairs should be scheduled to be completed within the next month. According to Article III, Section 2 (b) Windows and Doors – Declaration of Covenants, Conditions & Restrictions - The Owner shall be responsible for maintenance, repair and replacement (except painting) of windows (including window frames, sills, glass, window unit, muntins, mullions, etc.) and doors (including door frames and thresholds).

Drains between Houses in Swale Areas

Homeowners are encouraged to locate the drains between the houses in the swale areas. Some neighbors have found theirs clogged with grass and dirt, causing water to pool which encourages insects and wet grassy areas. Others found plastic bubble wrap under the drain grids, originally meant to keep dirt from entering the drains while the houses were under construction. The builder apparently forgot to remove them. NOT ALL HOMES HAVE DRAINS BETWEEN THE HOUSES! If you have drains there should be large black pipes at the rear end corners of your property that opens onto the grass or mulch area behind your property.

Planning on Making Any Changes or Additions to Your Property?

Don't forget whether you are planning to add new or change existing landscaping <u>anywhere</u> on your property or install improvements; i.e., attic fans, awnings, dormers, landscaping walls, pergolas, storm doors, water features, etc. those changes must be submitted to Madison Village and Charter Colony for approval. CHARTER COLONY RECYCLING PROGRAM UPDATE

The new Charter Colony Recycling Program with County Waste & Recycling is underway! By now, everyone participating in this program should have their new recycling cart. If you did not receive a new recycling cart with a green top from County Waste & Recycling and plan to participate, please contact them directly at 843-9288. Those residents who received a cart but are unable to store both the cart and the new trash container, as described in the governing documents, should contact County Waste to have the cart removed. As a reminder, Chesterfield County and CVWMA will no longer be servicing Colony residents' recycling Charter containers.

For those residents who would like to dispose of their small green recycling bins provided by the previous contractor, please place them in the new recycling cart on <u>June 4th</u>. For those residents who purchased the large 95 gallon recycling cart elsewhere, <u>prior</u> to this new program, and wish to dispose of them, please place them at the curb on <u>Saturday, June 6th</u>. County Waste & Recycling will be driving through Charter Colony and removing those for residents. None of the previous recycling containers from CVWMA can be used for the new recycling program.

Finally, the new recycling program is free to participating residents. The first weekly pick-up with the new recycling carts will start on <u>Thursday, June 4th</u>. Both the trash and recycling will be picked up every Thursday unless notified otherwise due to holidays, weather, etc. The cans should be placed on the curb with the front of the container facing the street. The cans should be side-by-side and 5 feet apart.
