Current monthly dues will remain @ \$206 for 2016, and the current level of service to the community will continue. As is customary, the budget submitted here is a balanced budget.

Highlights and/or changes:

- The lawn maintenance contract prices will remain at the same rate as 2015 prices. One nutsedge treatment and one insect spraying are included in the contract. The other services remain optional, and that cost is included under Grounds Improvement.
- Irrigation repairs and adjustments will be an ongoing item, so the budget has been increased.
- > Water usage would be expected to be about the same as the prior year.
- Snow removal budget left at \$6,000.
- We will fund the Reserve accounts in accordance with the level specified for 2016 in the new Reserve Study that was completed in 2015. In addition we are adding an amount for possible future HVAC enclosure replacements or improvements.
- > Our management contract price will remain the same as 2015.
