PROOF OF INSURANCE REQUIREMENT DEADLINE - SEPTEMBER 30, 2015

By September 30th, and each future year on the insurance renewal date, a DECLARATION PAGE, of all current individual homeowner insurance policies is required, to be sent to the attention of Tonya Duncan, Community Partners of Virginia Inc., 10800 Midlothian Tnpk, Suite 305, Richmond, Virginia 23235. Insurance agents may provide this Page, which can be faxed directly to Community Partners (804-794-3600), or emailed to <u>tduncan@communitypartnersva.com</u>. Please review the Declaration Page to be sure it includes the stated insurance values, as well as the fact that it is a replacement coverage policy.

SCREENS IN WINDOWS NEW RULE ADOPTED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

It shall be the policy of the Madison Village at Charter Colony Homeowners Association that all homeowners whose houses have second story windows that are adjacent to houses with vinyl siding shall maintain screens on them, at their own expense, at all times. If a homeowner fails to comply and the siding on their neighbor's house warps, the offending homeowner will be responsible for the cost of replacement.
